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# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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## 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Jeevanprabodhini Kanya Mahavidyalaya, vita was established in 2004 to Spread education in deprived, poverty stricken drought affected area in the Sangli District.

The College is a premier higher education Institution Situated at Vita Mayani Road Vita, of Sangli District in Maharashtra.

Jeevanprabodhini Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Vita is belongs to part of Khanapur tehsil in Sangli District. Khanapur tehsil is basically situated rural, hilly and drought affected areas. It is also semiarid region. Therefore, it receives few rainfalls in the monsoon season. Most of the population living around the Khanapur is dependent on agriculture. Therefore, girls are deprived of higher education, due to low income. Hence most of the people turn to alternative business of Bullion Refinery. This business is spread over India and many businessmen settle down in the various States for business purpose. So there is apathy about higher education. Without higher education they can't doing job, So the rate of education and employment of the girls in this area is very less.

Therefore, to fulfil the need of the rural students, specially girls about higher education and make them socially, economically and educationally strong. For this purpose Present MLA Hon. Mr. Anil (Bhau) Babar founded the Jeevanprabodhini organization and established Kanya Mahavidyalaya in Vita. Our college is one and only women's College in the Khanapur District.

The College from its beginning has been a key factor in bringing about transformation in the rural and drought prone area through education, bearing in the mind the motto of the Sanstha " Karyacha Mahadakanksha ".

The College fulfils its mission under the guidance of President, Management, Principal, Teaching and Non-teaching Staff and with Proper representation of students on various committees and activities. The committee has been constituted for keeping the record of ABC and providing the guidance to the students about the registration. The process of registration of Academic Bank credits has successfully implemented by the Institute on the ABC portal. The students are informed about registration process of ABC through College website and notice.
3. Skill development:	In accordance with the National Policy on Skill Development, the college has been imparting skill based short term courses every year with the active participation of the substantial number of students. The range of imparted skills is wide and varied from soft skills to ICT skills. Each department conducts at least one career oriented course related to the concerned subjects. Response: The College is consistently working for overall development of students. Enough care is taken for systematic implementation of prescribed syllabus. In staff meeting at beginning of term, Principal discusses about planning and implementation of curriculum designed by affiliated University. Every year an academic calendar is prepared by the IQAC after discussion with Principal. HOD's and Exam controller of College for a smooth conduct of various continuous internal evaluation activities. For the convenience of the students and the stakeholders, the academic calendar is displayed on the College notice board and it is also uploaded on the Institutional website. In very first Principal's address, students are informed about roadmap of curricular and co-curricular activities. College carried total, 38 subject related certificate courses in five years. During this period, 878 students have been enrolled and 870 students have completed their course. These courses increased the employability of the learners. The Institute offers more flexibility in academics for its learners. Staff attended workshops on revised curriculum which helped faculty to deliver curriculum effectively. The College organized one workshop on revised syllabus. Syllabus is distributed among faculties according to their interest and teaching experience which help to execute time table. At beginning of each semester, faculty prepares teaching plan of concerned syllabus. Heads of departments finalize departmental time-table in consultation with colleagues. Progress of teaching and learning is discussed with Principal. Academic diary is maintained. The College CIE controller prepares the schedule of the internal evaluation program to conduct for internal examination. Every department takes efforts for the innovative methods of continuous internal evaluation such as unit test, project works, surprise test, field work, survey, quiz competition, poetry recitation competition, class seminar, online tests, debate, group discussion, home assignments & open book tests are conducted by the concerned subject teachers. Regular departmental meetings play an important role in planning the curriculum delivery but also provide a platform to discuss the course contents, syllabus distribution, difficulties in delivering content, finalizing quality objectives and preparation of assessment methods. Teaching aids and ICT resources are used effectively during activities related to syllabus. Implementation of teaching plan is supervised periodically. The College has its own website on which curriculum is displayed. Faculty informs students about syllabus and reference books. Timetable is strictly implemented. Concerned heads shoulder responsibility of sincere implementation of academic teaching plan and collect syllabus completion report in stipulated period. Completion of syllabus is reported to Principal. Syllabus is revised after three years by affiliating University. Internet, Wi-Fi facility, LCD projectors, well equipped and spacious computer lab is availed by College for ICT based teaching-learning. Our College believes that proper planning and effective implementation helps in improving the quality of teaching-learning in jovial way and achieving program attainment very smooth way. IQAC monitors overall teaching and learning process through well-planned and documented process and by collecting students' feedback.

Volunteers clean the place by using broomsticks, spades, & other devices like cutters.
